Public Broadly Supports School Security Measures – But Not Armed Teachers and Staff

54th annual PDK Poll finds broad support for school security measures in the aftermath of the Robb Elementary School mass shooting.

ARLINGTON, VIRGINIA (August 11, 2022) – The 54th annual PDK Poll of the Public's Attitudes Toward the Public Schools demonstrates broad support for school security measures, with 80% of respondents supporting armed police officers on duty while classes are in session. When it comes to arming teachers and staff, however, support falls to only 45%.

Despite the mass shooting at Robb Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas, on May 24, 2022, overall attitudes are similar to the 2018 PDK Poll, which asked the same questions of public school parents after the mass shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida.

Other notable findings surrounding school security include:

- Allowing teachers and staff to arm themselves is the only item on which more Americans are strongly opposed, 34%, than strongly in favor, 21%. Strong opposition is in the single digits on all other suggested measures (armed police officers in school, metal detectors, and student mental health screenings).
- The sharpest divisions on school security issues are partisan, specifically on allowing armed teachers and staff. Seventy-two percent of Republicans support this, dropping to 42% of independents and 24% of Democrats.
- Armed police in schools is backed by 94% of Republicans, 78% of independents, and 70% of Democrats.
- Those with a high school diploma or less are 29 points more apt than postgraduates to strongly support metal detectors, 26 points more likely to strongly support armed police in schools, and 12 points more likely to strongly support allowing armed teachers and staff.
