Essay C contemporary education issue:

One issue in education today is the lack of diversity—both race and gender. This affect students because they cannot form a connection with their teacher, their teacher will not be able to understand what they are going through, and having a diverse group of teachers gives students new experiences.

"Researchers over the last two decades have increasingly gained access to data that shows students test scores are higher when the teacher is the same race as them." In my Intro to Education Class we had our unity on diversity. My teacher would talk about how she can try to understand but never will. In public schools there are many children of color. In 2018 80% of teachers were white, 6.7% were black or African American, 9.3% were Hispanic, 2.1% were Asian, 0.2% were Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, and 0.5% were Native American/ Alaska Native. These statistics show that there are many white teachers but not many teachers of color to match the fast-growing pace of students of color in public schools. Having a teacher with a different background as their students will give their students new perspectives.
