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# Introduction

An entire generation of students has been educated in the midst of a national teacher shortage, resulting from a series of national and state-specific systems that largely leave schools understaffed and educators undersupported, particularly those representing low-income communities and communities of color. Supporting workforce needs with future educators through effective programming, including community-grounded Grow-Your-Own (GYO) teacher preparation initiatives like Educators Rising, will remain a critical solution.

Educators Rising is a national nonprofit organization cultivating the next generation of highly skilled and culturally competent educators, thereby providing contextualized workforce solutions to local P-12 schools and local education agencies. Through innovative programming, curriculum, mentorship opportunities, chapters, conferences, competitions and hands-on experiences, Educators Rising empowers aspiring educators to explore, develop, and refine their teaching skills while addressing the pressing need for diversity and excellence within the teaching profession.<sup>1</sup>

This unique GYO model of support plays a crucial role in supporting communities by addressing teacher shortages, promoting diversity and representation, building trust and connection, empowering community leadership, and promoting economic development.

The organization's initiatives include structured curricula, mentorship programs, leadership development opportunities, and experiential learning activities—all designed to foster a deep sense of purpose and commitment among aspiring educators. Through its national network of chapters including over **25,000 students in 1,000 high schools in all 50 states**, Educators Rising connects students with mentors, educators, and educational institutions, creating a supportive ecosystem that nurtures their growth and prepares them for successful careers in education. Students also participate in local, regional, and national competitions annually, which are themed around the Educators Rising curriculum.

Educators Rising offers a multitude of benefits for participants, educational institutions, and the broader community. For students, participation in Educators Rising cultivates a passion for teaching, enhances leadership skills, and provides valuable exposure to the realities of the teaching profession. By engaging in handson experiences such as classroom observations, lesson planning, and student teaching, participants gain practical insights into effective teaching practices and develop a deep understanding of the diverse needs of students.

Furthermore, Educators Rising serves as a pipeline for recruiting and retaining diverse, qualified educators who are reflective of the communities they serve. By actively recruiting students from underrepresented backgrounds and providing them with tailored support and mentorship, Educators Rising addresses the systemic inequities that have historically marginalized certain groups within the teaching profession. As a result, participating students are empowered to become agents of change within their communities, advocating for equitable access to quality education for all students. **Because 60% of teachers end up teaching within 20 miles of where they went to high school, we have seen this model become one of the most successful programs at diversifying the workforce with our program mirroring the national demographics:** 52% of students nationwide are **students of color and 53% of Educators Rising students are as well.**<sup>2</sup>

#### Addressing the Need for Educators

The imperative for diverse, qualified educators has never been more pressing. Research consistently demonstrates the positive impact of diverse teachers on student outcomes, including academic achievement, graduation rates, and socio-emotional development. The teacher shortage is not uniform across the profession. Shortages are often more acute in subjects like math, science, special education, and in rural or low-income areas.<sup>3</sup> The resulting larger class sizes, use of long-term substitutes, and hiring of underqualified teachers can affect the quality of education students receive.<sup>4</sup> Additionally, many students do not have teachers who reflect their racial or ethnic backgrounds, which may impact their sense of belonging and educational outcomes.<sup>5</sup>

Educators Rising directly addresses this gap by actively recruiting and supporting students from underrepresented backgrounds who aspire to become educators. Roughly 53 percent of students who participate in Educators Rising Programming are students of color. By providing culturally relevant curriculum, mentorship from diverse educators, and opportunities for community engagement, Educators Rising equips students with the skills and confidence needed to succeed in the teaching profession and become advocates for educational equity.





## **General Operations**

To sustain and expand its impactful programming, Educators Rising seeks funding support from philanthropic organizations committed to advancing educational excellence and equity through sustainable workforce solutions. A general operations grant of \$1 million will enable Educators Rising to:

- Scale programming to reach a broader audience of students across diverse communities by hiring additional curriculum implementation specialists along with outreach and engagement staff. Additional staffing is necessary to address the large pipeline of districts that are ready to partner with Educators Rising.
- Enhance professional development and networked collaboration opportunities for educators and mentors involved in the program.
- Develop innovative resources and curricula that address emerging trends and challenges in education.
- Strengthen partnerships with educational institutions, community organizations, and policymakers to promote systemic change within the education system.
- Negotiate dual enrollment and registered apprenticeship agreements with states and districts that need additional support, including our unique model as a pre-apprenticeship.
- Foster and deliver to the field the highest quality research on the effectiveness of future educator programs.
- Target workforce programs specifically focused on diversity of the teacher and principal pipeline.
